- BOS review is de novo


What is a Reclamation Plan?

- Reclamation = exit strategy for mining, leave mined lands in usable condition, remediate hazards
- Every Surface Mine <u>must</u> have a Reclamation Plan

Past surface mining without Reclamation




Abandoned Talc Mine – Death Valley, CA









Reclaims all Disturbed Areas, Increased Financial Security

Appeals

(1) Lehigh Appeal –

Four Conditions of Approval

- Condition #45 Air Quality / Health Hazards
- Conditions #80 & 81 Water Quality Monitoring
- Condition #90 Groundwater monitoring

 Staff Recommendation – approve appeal – reinstate original conditions

Appeals

- (2) Bay Area Clean Environment (BACE)
- (3) QuarryNo
- (4) Midpenninsula Regional Open Space District (MROSD)

- Seek to overturn approval of Reclamation Plan
- Question adequacy of EIR

- Cement Plant Inclusion in Reclamation Plan
 - County and State determined Cement Plant separate from mining.
 - August 27, 2007 Letter from State Office of Mine and Reclamation:
 - Cement Plant used for manufacturing cement, not mining
 - Cement Plant operates under separate Use Permit


 EIR Alternatives inadequate – Prohibit overburden in EMSA.

- EIR evaluated other Alternatives
 - Central Material Storage Area alternative location
 - Complete Backfill overburden removed to pit
 - No Project delay in Reclamation

Project is environmental superior to alternatives

Removal of Overburden from site - infeasible

- Selenium Impacts SMARA Findings
- EIR conclusion Reclamation will reduce existing selenium levels below Water Quality stds.



- Other Issues raised in Appeals—
 - Health Risk Assessment
 - Diesel Particulate Matter (PM 2.5)
 - Scenic Easement
 - Hazardous Materials / Soil Contamination
 - EIR Baseline
 - Economic Analysis
 - Vested Rights
- Staff Report Discussion
- Staff Determination

Overall Staff Response

- EIR complies with California Environmental Quality Act
- Reclamation Plan Amendment meets SMARA requirements

- Quarry has Vested Right to Mine
- No other alternative for Reclamation is less environmental harmful than proposed Plan

Objectives – Reclamation Plan

- Addresses two existing Violations
 - mining outside Reclamation plan boundaries
- Financial Assurance
 - Increased from \$11 million to over \$47 million
- Higher Performance Standards
 - Revegetation, Covers all disturbed areas
 - Minimize Selenium runoff
- Increased Monitoring / Reporting

Staff Recommendation

- Approve Appeal from Lehigh Conditions
- Deny Appeals from BACE, Quarry No, MROSD
- Adopt Resolution
 - Ratify the certification of the Final EIR.
 - Make required findings per CEQA.
 - Adopt a statement of overriding considerations
 - Adopt the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program.
 - Approve the Reclamation Plan Amendment with conditions of approval, as modified.
