Project Description

This will be a transformative project for the Graduate School of Education (GSE), and involves a significant renovation of the existing Education Building, including seismic/structural, MEP systems, and code-driven improvements, historical refurbishment, new offices, classrooms and creation of a new 3-story forum for large gatherings, presentations and programs. A new 4-story building will be constructed to house additional offices, classroom and administrative functions for the GSE. A new connective courtyard/commons will be created between the two buildings, along with landscaping, site work and utilities. The completed project forms a consolidated mini-campus for the GSE to showcase its impact on education teaching and research.

Project Need and Objectives

The Stanford Graduate School of Education desires to strengthen its identity on campus, create efficiencies for its programs, and provide opportunities for its students and faculty to collaborate in a more central footprint. The School currently has distributed programs across campus, and this proposed project will enable them to consolidate their programs into one location.

Project Components

The project will include:

- a seismic retrofit and façade restoration for the existing North Building,
- a partial demolition of the existing Barnum Center, and
- the construction of a new South Building.

Proposed Renovation of Education Building (North Building):

The existing Education building at 485 Lasuen Mall is a reinforced concrete-and-steel building. The proposal for the Education building, also named the North Building, includes façade and interior renovation, historic rehabilitation, structural and seismic upgrades, MEP, and code-driven improvements. The proposed change to the exterior is to only about 8% of the perimeter of the façade. The North Building will continue to be used as classrooms, offices, library, and lecture hall.

The proposed renovation of the Education (North) building will add 1,550 academic square feet.

Proposed Partial Demolition of existing Barnum Center:

The existing Barnum Center at 505 Lasuen Mall is proposed to be partially demolished. Stanford proposes the construction of a new four-story steel-framed office and classroom building adjacent to the c. 1906 portion. This portion is fully sprinklered from a previous renovation and this project will

make minor modifications to the previously renovated mechanical, electrical, plumbing and fire protection systems for the current design and for current code compliance.

The demolition will remove 7,198 academic square feet from the Barnum Center.

Proposed construction of new South building

A new building is proposed south of the Education (North) Building. The new South building will partially overlap with the demolished portion of the Barnum Center.

The proposed new South building is 53,841 academic square feet.

Academic square footage summary

The net change for the entire project is 48,095 net new academic square feet.

Proposed Connections and Site Work:

The project includes the creation of a connective courtyard between the two buildings. Landscaping, site work and utility work are also proposed.
