Event description Rancho Grande

The events at Rancho Grande de Morgan Hill are one of a kind. They have been going on for several years already. They are seasonal events that only occur from the months of May through October. These events occur twice a month every other week, all ages are welcome and it is mostly so families could have an outing and enjoy a nice Sunday afternoon. The hours of operation are from 12:00pm to 7:00pm, we never usually go past 7:00 pm preferably because we don't want to disturb the neighbors. Towards the beginning of the event the private securities are required to search every individual that goes inside the event, for everyone's safety. We have approximately 20-25 employees throughout the event, which includes parking staff, beer distributors, main entrance, etc. As far as private securities there are at least 25 securities from Quality Securities for every event. There are never more than 1200 people during the event including staff. The premises has only 2 patrons for the events that occur at Rancho grande de Morgan Hill.

Throughout the event we have PBR professional Bull riders, which involves young men who ride the bulls and try to stay on the bull for as long as they can. While the bull riders are transitioning from one bull to another they're games for children to participate in, such as "whoever brings me their dads boot first wins \$20" so we have ten little kids running around the arena carrying their dads boot. We also do dance battles with small children which gives all the families a good laugh. When we are not doing the PBR we invite Escaramuza El Centenario from San Martín, Ca & Charros El Centenario from San Martín, Ca to do a performance. The escaramuza consists of a group of eight ladies with beautiful dresses riding horses and doing a choreographed that is synchronized to music. The charros usually do tricks with their rope while they're riding the horses and also do El Paso de la muerte where they have to jump from one horse to another without a riding chair all while both horses are running against the edge of the arena. Once we clear the arena from the bulls and horses we open the arena for everyone to come down and dance. We see all different ages dancing around the arena and having a good time. The artists usually perform for 45 minutes and they are usually two different artists. We stop serving alcohol an hour before the event and when the event is over we have parking staff directing the traffic as the vehicles exit the premises.
